Getting started

- Guide from the Commission on Chicago Landmarks: Your House Has a History
- **Street number changes** Most street numbers changed in 1909. If your house was built before 1909, find the pre-1909 address in this street renumbering guide.
- Street name changes did the street name change? See this <u>list of street name changes</u>.

General Building Information, including building permits

- Index to the American's Contractor, Chicago's building permit column, 1898–1912
- Referral: Chicago History Museum has building permits on microfilm (1872-1954)
- <u>Digitized building permits</u> from UIC
- Chicago Historic Resources Survey, for pre-1940 structures
- Cook County Assessor's Office search to find the age of your home

Reverse Directories

Chicago Elite Directory 1883-1884

- Blue Book 1876-1916
- 1928 Polk Criss Cross (actual link: http://www.chsmedia.org/househistory/polk/Menus/PolkA.pdf)
 Note that this directory lists Chicago Streets in alphabetical order, and then street addresses in numeric order for each street. For each street address, it then shows the names of the occupants. Each letter of the alphabet has a different link. The one shown above gets you to the "A" streets. To search for a street name beginning with a different letter, very carefully change "POLKA) in the url to POLK followed by the letter of the alphabet you are looking for. Example: To get to the B streets, the url is http://www.chsmedia.org/househistory/polk/Menus/PolkB.pdf

- <u>Familysearch.org</u> free registration required
- Ancestry Library Edition (available through CPL online resources normally in-library use only; currently available to CPL patrons off-site through December 31, 2020)
- HeritageQuest (CPL databases)

(As a workaround for the missing 1890 census, try searching for males living in Chicago in the 1888, 1890, 1892 Chicago, Illinois Voter Registration access via Ancestry Library Edition)
